The Brownfield Reuse and Environmental Workforce (BREW) Program is a US Environmental Protection Agency-funded program that provides training for careers in environmental investigation, environmental remediation, restoration, and site services. These jobs are in growing demand across San Diego and California with average starting wages of \$22/hour. This program provides you with federal certifications, career-specific training, and career support including employer connections and job placement assistance.

The approximately 12-week long part-time BREW Program includes:

6 Online Workforce Training Courses (48 hours total)

- Pollution to Possibility: Communities in Transition
- Environmental Sampling & Monitoring
- Brownfield Data Collection & Analysis
- Community Engagement & Project Coordination
- Brownfield Regulatory Compliance & Environmental Standards
- Brownfields, Contaminants, & Hazardous Materials Handling

4 In-Person Federal Certifications (62 hours total)

- 40-hour HAZWOPER (Hazardous Waste Operations & Emergency Response)
- 10-Hour OSHA Construction Safety
- 4-Hour Confined Space Entry Certification
- 8-hour First Aid / CPR
